RESOLUTION CONFIRMING SANITATION SERVICE FEES AND LANDFILL DISPOSAL CHARGES (TIPPING FEES)

WHEREAS, the City of Wells Board of Councilmen has the authority pursuant to Section 6, 4, 4, B, Wells City Code, to enter into a franchise contract for collection, transportation and disposal of municipal solid waste; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wells did enter into a contract with Elko Sanitation Company on November 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Paragraph 4 of the Franchise Agreement entitled "Service Fee" allow that service fees be set from time to time by resolution of the Board of Councilmen; and

WHEREAS, recent increase in employee wage costs and benefits have necessitated an increase in collection fees; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wells Board of Councilmen has the authority pursuant to Section 6, 14, 13 and 6, 4, 14 to set landfill disposal charges by resolution; and

WHEREAS, said landfill disposal charges were originally established by motion of the Board in November, 1993; and

WHEREAS, costs incurred in connection with providing such services has forced the City of Wells Board of Councilmen to re-evaluate the existing fee structure and subsequently to change this fee;

To: The Honorable Mayor Walz:

Wells Main Street has completed its first year goal of dressing up downtown/main street by hiring the muralist to paint two murals, purchasing the banners, purchasing a trash can for the Heritage park and purchasing the benches. We also painted three buildings in dire need of paint—the Shellcrest back, the Victory Motel back and the Mainstreet fitness building. We paid for new concrete on the side of Thrifty Suzies as well as new signage for Thrifty Suzies, Mainstreet Gym, the El Rancho and the electronic reader board. It was a total investment of \$125,000 not including Public Works' assistance with concrete under the benches, assembly and banner hanging.

Secondly, Wells Main Street hosted the Swap Meet during the car show and the Holiday Bazaar. We have also been active in the City RuBA program funded through CDBG to bring training and knowledge to Wells businesses. These activities have created demand for space—space that is affordable, space that is professional and space that complies with occupancy requirements. Our vision is to purchase one of the vacant motels and restore and repurpose the site to a street mall for new businesses. We have an ice cream shop, a clothing retailer, a floral shop, a salon and more that are ready to move forward in business.

At this time, Wells Main Street would like to request \$50,000 of ARPA funds to purchase and start the restoration process. We have a pledge from Nevada Gold Mine, Elko Sanitation as well as we have had several fund raisers and several grant requests. If the grant funding is committed, it will allow Wells Main Street to complete the entire project. Without it, we will create a phased approach to get these businesses open and operational as soon as possible.

We hope you will consider our request.

All bids must be signed and accompanied by evidence of authority to sign.

Bids must be accompanied by Bid Security in the form of a bid bond, certified check, cashiers check or cash in the amount of five percent (5%) of the amount of said bid proposal. Said bid security shall be forfeited to the City of Wells, as liquidated damages should the successful bidder fail to enter into a contract in accordance with their proposal as specified in the instructions to Bidders.
